Gaming spaces, where we spend so much time in a state of recreation, can limit, expand, and warp our understanding of our lives and the world.

These altered, not yet fully explored perspectives affect how we move through virtual realms, ultimately influencing how we conceive, build, and occupy the physical spaces around us. Technologies can expand, change, innovate, and grow obsolete in a heartbeat as they blossom into bursts of chromatic color and move us with the simplest of achromatic shadows.
